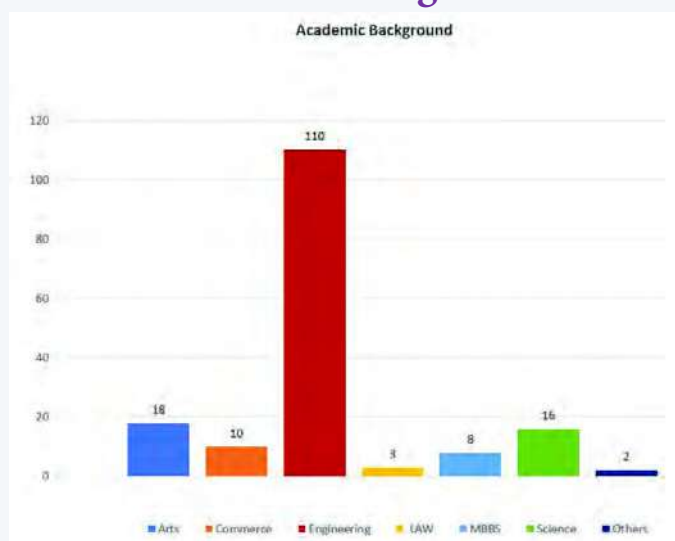

Amused at the symphony of many a foot of my platoon mates and armed with a rifle of a mini-LPG cylinder's weight and spanning half my height, I marched past the famed Michelangelo square thinking about the three-month old life as a probationer in the Academy.

Rising much before the sun did, sweating out in the ground, running rounds after rounds at the stadium, stretching out every muscle in the body, life has literally been a roller-coaster ride.

Climbing on the rope ladder, going ape at the Tarzan swing, doing the "catwalk" which is no cakewalk, vaulting left and right, jumping off walls and across ditches, I found the daredevil in me poking its reluctant head!
